

Itinerary 3 – Historic & Cultural Day Out

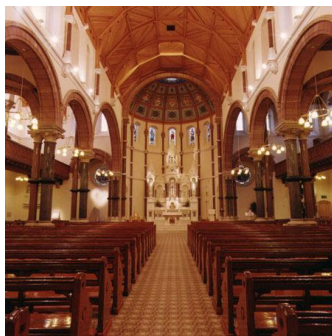
Stretching from towering Cave Hill to the waterfront from which so much of Belfast's wealth was generated, North Belfast has played a vital role in the city's life from its 17th century origins onwards

Choose either to explore the area's historic and cultural sites on foot or why not use the service of a local guide who will add a personal insight to your day.

Start your day within **The Cathedral Quarter**, visiting **The War Museum** in Talbot Street.

Proceed from the Museum to **St Anne's Cathedral**, a must see for all visitor's to North Belfast. Take a tour of the Cathedral and witness some of the areas finest architecture.

After leaving The Cathedral stop off for mid morning coffee at one of the quarters many **coffee shops** or cafes.



Continue your tour along the 'Cultural Corridor' to the heart of North Belfast, passing by **St Patricks Church** and choose to visit one of the many historic and cultural spaces within North Belfast such as:

Clifton House (Booking essential)

Crumlin Road Jail (see www.gotobelfast.com for tour schedule)

Belfast Castle

Clifton Street Graveyard (booking essential)



Stop off for lunch along **The Antrim Road** and experience the warmth and hospitality of offer within local communities.

After visiting the many historic sites, choose to spend the afternoon walking through the oasis that is **The Water Works Park**. Home to greyleg geese, mallards and many other varieties of birds, the park offers some of the best nature walks in the city.
